A Message from the SBRGC President

Welcome to 2020! With any luck, every member of the club got their Christmas wish or the firearm related accessory.

The Club Election will be held this month. An 8 page newsletter was mailed to all members which contained the official ballot, either mail it in OR attend the General Membership meeting on January 28 2020 at the VFW hall in Lemon Grove. (Please note, if you mail it, it MUST be received BEFORE 1/28/20)

The Club's Annual Banquet Dinner is just around the corner, it will be held on February 22, 2020 at Viejas Casino (Same Place as last year). Contact Bailey Hom (CRSO) to get your name on the reservation list. Information is available on the web page calendar. This year you will be required to check in to get your wrist band which will get you access to the banquet hall.

Range/Ranch Development is currently working or tracking the following main projects:

- New well for the Range Complex and upgrades to the water system.
- * We have received proposed locations for the new well from our geologists and they are under evaluation.
- * The Club is currently trying to set aside enough capital to drill the well and do the connections from the well location to the current water system but we continue to get setbacks in funding and water issues that keep cropping up that hinder the process. (Water Leaks in the old system that require repair on the spot)
- * We are modifying the water building to accommodate the new well once its drilled and operational.
- Water System (Ranch) refurbishment: in progress.
- * Replacing some conduit for the new water building at the ranch
- Two Sump Drains (Range 2 and Range 3). Please be careful around the drains. Estimated completion time is 3 months. Foundation for the Sump Drain on range 3 has been poured and the containment box should be done by the time you read this newsletter.

You are all invited to attend the WORK PARTY on Jan 4 2020 and then enjoy some shooting in the afternoon. The work will be at both the Range and Ranch. Just email me at president@sbrgc.org so we can ensure we have ample food. Start time 7:30. (Note: Range 2 and Range 3 will be closed for sump drain work, if not completed before the work party)

Some of the scheduled work includes:

- ◆ Expose a water pipe on Range 5 based on the latest leak.
- ◆ Range 3 Sump Drain dirt work to finish up the drain
- ◆ Concrete work on the sump drain on R2
- ◆ Work on the water building on the range complex.
- ⇒ Incorporating the piping for the new well (When drilled).
- ⇒ Expansion of the Back-Flow prevention device by the Booster Pump Building to separate the Potable from the Non-Potable systems.
- ◆ Tree/Weed trimming at the Ranch
- ◆ Continued welding work on the enclosure for ammo cans, brass sales and rifle rest stowage.
- ◆ Removal of the concrete forms around the drain cleanout from the sink on R2.
- ◆ Maintenance yard setup (Starting to move in)
- ◆ Tractor work at the ranch for ground clearing and back fill of the sewer trench.

NRA High Power Rifle Match

A frequent question asked about the NRA High Power Match and the CMP Match is can one use a scoped rifle in these Matches. The answer is a very definitive ... well, maybe.

Since scopes have become so popular on the various AR-15 platforms this is a very reasonable question. Certainly, many shooters welcome the option of using optics. As of 2016 both the CMP and the NRA changed their Service Rifle rules to allow optical sights. Both rule books state the telescopic sights objective lens is restricted to a maximum diameter of 34 mm. The magnification is also restricted to a maximum of 4.5x, and variable magnification scopes are allowed.

At SBR&GC, we are not totally without heart toward guys with a non-compliant scope. We can let them fire out of competition as "Any Sight Match Rifle".

The rule books aside, I have a typical admonition to new shooters. Don't buy a scope, but rather concentrate on the fundamentals of marksmanship. When they achieve at least Expert Classification, then possibly get a scope. Of course, the fundamentals get you shooting better, the scope only allows you to see better. For older shooters I would say consider a scope. Shooters with "older eyes" often need a scope to allow them to stay competitive.
